Politicisation of floods in Pakistan: An assessment of twitter trends

November 15, 2022

Ms. Laraib Farhat, Asst. Research Officer at IRS delivered a talk on her study published by PIDE, titled, 'Politicization of Floods in Pakistan: An assessment of Twitter Trends.' She explained how she carried out a detailed discourse analysis of Twitter conversations around floods in Pakistan and found some thought-provoking hashtags which showed the overt politicization of Floods in Pakistan, 2022. She argued that, 1/3rd of the country was drowning in flood water but the political leaders took this disaster as an opportunity to push their narrative while deflecting blame and portraying local governments and political parties as ineffective. She concluded that, one, the discourse on floods pervading Twitter was primarily political. Two, Twitter users were more focused on directing their anger toward political parties for not responding effectively to the situation and three, Current state of institutional frameworks (which are already inadequate) available for disaster management bears minimal space for political influence on digital spaces.



Contemporary Socio-Political Dynamics in Iran

November 18, 2022

More than 40 years had passed since the Revolution, and Iran had experienced protests through the years over a series of issues. However, this recent chaos had been the most longstanding agitation staged since the Revolution, said Ambassador Riffat Masood. November 24, 2022






Core Leadership Skills

December 20, 2022

A seminar on "Incorporating Human-Centered Design in Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence (AI) was held at the Institute of Regional Studies (IRS) Islamabad. The talk was part of the series planned under "Understanding Cybersecurity in the Context of Peace". Speaking on the importance of web security, Dr. Waleed Bin Shahid, Assistant Professor in the Department of Information Security, NUST-MCS, said that the web sector was impacted the most in the top 50 known data breaches from 2004 to 2021, with 9.9billions records lost. He said that websites were the face of organizations and these web attacks could result in massive data breaches, as well as economic and reputational loss, not only at the organizational level but at the national level as well. This could become an even more serious issue in the absence of cybercrime regulations. He also said that developers were not very well versed in cybersecurity so they left a lot of loopholes in their own system which actually invited attackers to intrude into a system easily.




